# Presentation: Freshwater Harmful Algal Blooms in California: Recent Events and Impacts (Dr. Meredith Howard/ SCCWRP)

Dr. Meredith Howard presented to stakeholders on Harmful Algal Blooms in California and some preliminary results from SCCWRP's Lake Elsinore and Canyon Lake HAB Assessment Study.

Howard noted that the Lake Elsinore and Canyon Lake report will be available in December 2017.

# Recommendation: Consider Support for Algae Toxicity Monitoring at Lake Elsinore and Canyon Lake (LESJWA Staff)

Mark Norton said a request was received from lake operators from both lakes to the Task Force to add algae toxicity monitoring to the regular LE&CL TMDL Compliance Monitoring program. He noted that he had reached out to staff at Amec Foster Wheeler for a recommendation on a monitoring plan and cost. Amec Foster Wheeler provided a rough estimate at \$30,000 annually based upon the current monitoring being performed for the City of Lake Elsinore.

Following initial discussion, Mark Norton requested the input of the Task Force Compliance expert, Tim Moore. Mr. Moore said he is reversing his previous recommendation in light of the toxicity results for 2015 and 2016, and the massive change in lake salinity due to the significant input of water into the lakes, especially Lake Elsinore. He added that this provides a unique opportunity for the Task Force to collect data to study the relationship between salinity and bacteria, and bacteria and toxicity. His recommendation to the Task Force is to add algae toxicity monitoring to the regular LE&CL TMDL Compliance Monitoring program for this year.

Following further discussion, Phuong Hunter, representing the City of Beaumont, requested tabling this item until the next meeting. It was requested that a formal proposal including a scope of work, budget, and schedule be prepared for discussion for the next Task Force meeting. Additionally, it was requested that Risk Sciences prepare a one-page memorandum detailing how this monitoring would benefit to the Task Force Stakeholders.
